From our Deputy Principal

Again, it's been quite a busy week at Macquarie Primary School.

Last week, two of our students participated in the ACT Swimming Carnival. Well done to Khoi and An Le who represented our school and put so much effort into their swims. Congratulations to Khoi. He came third in two events.

Tomorrow, we have our annual Cross Country event. Children can wear their house colours to school and can expect a whole lot of 'fun' running in the afternoon. Our competitive runners will do their race straight after lunch. Obviously, this is all reliant on the weather so keep a close eye on the Facebook page and Dojo in case we need to postpone.

Teachers, like students, are always learning at Macquarie Primary School. We've had a long and deep focus on writing and this week Danielle led us in some training in maths. Teachers explored stages of development in mathematics learning and strategies to support students deepening their learning. The afternoon very much focussed on building strong foundational skills in maths that support learning in later years.

On Tuesday, Stacey and Veronique led teachers in looking at reading assessments. Teachers collect evidence of students reading development in so many ways but there a couple of assessments we use across the school which help us identify what strategies students are using and what learning needs to happen next. These assessments, along with observations, small group teaching, one to one reading, cooperative and guided reading experiences, allow teachers to collect a broad range of information about each student to target learning.

Goodluck to the year 6 band students who will be going to combined band practice next week.

Students in year 3 & 5 start NAPLAN next week and you will find the schedule in the newsletter today. It is really helpful if students have a good sleep, healthy breakfast and arrive at school on time on testing days.

Over the next two weeks students will participate in the ACER Social Emotional Wellbeing survey. A note was sent home about this last week so please return it if you wish to opt out of the survey. The survey is one way we will be collecting data to help us identify students who may benefit from a range of programs we will be implementing over the next two or three years that support wellbeing and mental health. We also encourage parents to refer their children. If your child experiences anxiety (doesn't have to be diagnosed), social withdrawal, poor attendance, difficulties attending to tasks, low mood, a family history of mental illness, known history of trauma or if you are generally concerned about your child's mood, wellbeing, mental health or coping strategies then please collect a referral, fill it in and return it to the front office by Friday 28 May. A referral form can be emailed to you or collected from the front office. All information will be kept confidential and parent consent will be gained to share information about individual students.

The Smith Family are currently offering *Learning For Life* scholarships for children at Macquarie Primary School. These scholarships provide financial assistance from a sponsor to help disadvantaged families afford the cost of their child's education. If your family could use additional help with the cost of uniforms and school supplies please contact the front office and we can arrange an application. The Smith Family will require applicants to do an interview to discuss the scholarship and possible supports.

Next Monday we are having new playground equipment installed at the preschool. An area of the preschool playground will be fenced off while the playground is installed. Here is an image of the new equipment.

NAPLAN TESTING 2021

Year 3 and year 5 students will be participating in the 2021 NAPLAN testing over the next two weeks. There are four tests in total:

1. Writing (year 3 students will complete a paper-based writing test whilst year 5 students will complete the writing test online)
2. Reading (year 3 and year 5 complete this test online)
3. Conventions of Language (year 3 and year 5 complete this test online)
4. Numeracy (year 3 and year 5 complete this test online)

Good preparation for the day is the key. You can help your child by having them go to bed early the night before, having a healthy breakfast to start the day. Keep stress levels low and arrive at school before 9.00am. Encourage your child to 'give it a go' and 'try their best' on the day.

MANAGING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS IN MACQUARIE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The ACT Government is committed to ensuring all public school buildings are safe and have the infrastructure to support high-quality education.

Most ACT public schools were built at a time when asbestos and lead paint were widely used in the building industry. As [a recently published list of schools shows](#), 76 of our 89 schools have lead paint and/or asbestos. Nearly all asbestos in ACT public schools is non-friable, also known as bonded or sheet asbestos.

Macquarie Primary was opened in 1968 and both lead paint and asbestos are present at our school.

We know where these materials exist, or are likely to exist, we monitor the locations regularly and we have a management strategy in place to keep our school community safe. Detailed reports are kept at the front office in a Hazardous Materials Register which you are welcome to view.

If you have any general questions about how we manage hazardous materials drop by the front office, or come along to an information night at UC Senior Secondary College Lake Ginninderra on Thursday 13 May from 6-8pm.

The session will include members of the Education Directorate's Hazardous Materials Taskforce, and lead paint expert Professor Mark Taylor. He is one of the specialists guiding hazardous materials work in ACT public schools ensuring our management is informed by international best practice.

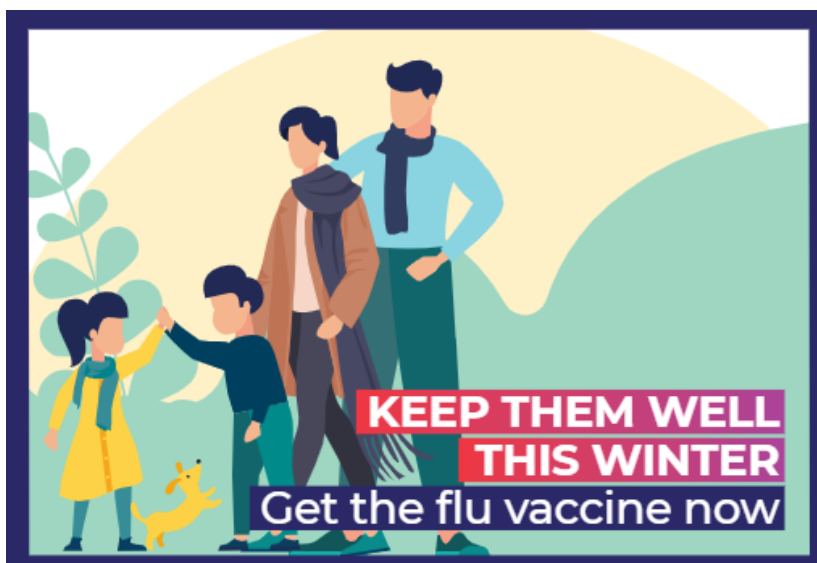
The ACT Government has committed \$15 million to remove hazardous materials from public schools during the next four years. This is in addition to a school upgrade budget of \$99 million which will also help manage lead paint and asbestos.
