## From our Deputy Principal

Dear Families and Friends

ICAS continued last week with both writing and spelling complete. This week we have our last two ICAS – English and Mathematics. Also last week our preschool students spent time at the Arboretum. They were very lucky to experience some beautiful spring weather on those days.

ACT Athletics ran smoothly thanks to the talented Ross. Congratulations to those children who participated and represented our school with such integrity.



Gardening Club have been busily planting in the Indigenous Garden. We had Adam Shipp come and talk about bush foods and the students selected appropriate plants and designed the layout for the space. This space is located behind the hall at the junior school end of the garden beds if you would like to admire the hard work of our students.

Staff participated in professional learning with Kath Murdoch last week to deepen our understanding and strengthen our implementation of inquiry. We talked about strategies to support student transference of learning from one task to another or one setting to another. We also talked about supporting students to create open ended questions to drive their inquiry into a topic.

This week, on Thursday afternoon, we are celebrating student's growth and achievement through Learning Journeys. Learning Journeys are an opportunity for parents and carers to hear about the work that has been done this year. The students have been thinking deeply about the learning they have done, why the learning was important, what they achieved and how they can further progress. Parents and carers can help their child on the afternoon by using prompting question such as:

What did you do to complete this task?  
What knowledge/skills/understanding does this demonstrate?  
What was most challenging about this?  
How is your work different now to at the beginning of the year?  
What are your future goals for learning? What skills/knowledge/ understanding can you develop in the future?

Taking it deeper  
What learning has been the hardest for you this year?  
Why do you think that is?  
What strategies do you use to help you persevere when you find learning challenging?  
Of all the goals you have set in classes which one would you most like to accomplish?  
How can I help you achieve that?  
What strategies do you already know to help you achieve your goal? Are there key people who can help you too?

On the afternoon of the Learning Journey we will have a display of the school values review in the foyer. This will enable parents to have further discussion about what they believe are the most pertinent values for all our community. We are looking to identify core values which are shared by all our community - what values do we hope all our students can take from Macquarie Primary School to set them up for success in the future? Thank you to those parents who attended the Values Review parent consultation last Thursday. It was a very worthwhile discussion.

Also, in the foyer families can come and meet Ryan Cook, our Family Support Worker. Ryan joins us from Belconnen Community Services and will work at the school up to two days a week supporting families with family support groups, connecting with mental health supports, after school activities for children, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander groups, advocacy and support, social support groups and activities, youth services, tenancy and housing advocacy just to name a few.
