From our Deputy

Dear families

Over the past few weeks teachers have been participating in professional learning about human development, relationships and protective behaviours with staff from Sexual Health and Family Planning ACT (SHFPACT). This professional learning will inform the development of our Personal, Social and Community Health learning across the school, based on Australian Curriculum outcomes. Each year students will participate in a range of Social and Emotional Learning which will include Personal, Social and Community Health, school expectations and values and the MindUP curriculum which supports students to understand how their brain functions, provides insight into their own minds and behaviours as well as those of the people around them.

This week students in years 4-6 will be completing the **School Satisfaction & Climate Survey** with their teachers. The information from the survey helps shape the direction of the school and system. It shows us what is going well and where the areas for improvement are. Parents should receive an email this week containing instructions on how to complete the survey. Please take fifteen minutes to complete the survey to help us be the best we can be.

Writing is a focus of our School Plan so I'd like to share some insights into our approach. Teachers work with students to build skills and knowledge across a number of elements that enable students to be more effective writers. Those elements include:

- generating ideas for writing and modelling how to do this
- organising ideas so they are sequenced and coherent
- selecting vocabulary carefully to create the impact intended
- writing sentences that make sense, are grammatically correct and flow well
- applying spelling knowledge in the context of writing
- applying punctuation knowledge
- editing
- handwriting and typing skills (typing in senior years and early years are focussed on developing fine motor control).

Our students write everyday as research tells us children need regular and sustained opportunities to practise and refine skills taught. Not all writing is in the literacy block but throughout the day teachers plan a writing opportunity.

We plan to do a modified Combined Band for band students this term. The groups will be smaller and unfortunately there won't be a parent audience due to COVID restrictions. Year 6 band will be on the 11 September at Macquarie Primary School. Year 5 band will have their Combined Band on 14 September at Weetangera Primary School.

FROM THE PRESIDENT


Dear Community,

With Covid-19 still preventing face to face activities, the P&C is looking at other non-contact ways we can help the school.

One way we can all support the school and help the environment is to participate in the ACT Container Deposit Scheme. For every eligible container we recycle, the school can get 10 cents. This can really add up.

Eligible containers include most plastic, cardboard and metal containers between 150ml and 3L.

We hope that we can soon organise a day when the kids can bring containers to school for us to send to recycling (maybe even make a competition between classes). In the meantime, if you have eligible containers and can drop them off to a collection point, you can use the Macquarie Primary School telephone number below so the containers get credited to the P&C account.



The closest collection points are at the Hawker Shops, the ACT Basketball Courts in Belconnen and Anglicare Retail store at the Jamison Centre.
