From our Principal

Only a year or two ago we did a values review. This process involved consultation with our community to really unpack what the key values were that we wanted all students to leave Macquarie Primary School with – values that would shape their lives and values that aligned with what parents wanted for their children into the future.

As a school we believe students learn best when they feel safe, valued and happy. Our staff is committed to providing an environment that nurtures personal growth and self-esteem. The school values underpin how we support our students to interact in positive and productive ways.

Integrity – this was chosen because it incorporates so many of our previous values including acceptance, honesty, responsibility, respect and kindness. When explaining this with children we talk about ‘making good choices, even when it’s hard’ and ‘making good choices, even when no one is looking.’

Persistence – this value is about persisting with tasks and learning, being resilient, and continuing to strive to achieve goals despite challenges. When explaining this to children we talk about ‘trying different strategies to overcome challenges,’ ‘having a go and learning from mistakes,’ ‘following through on commitments’ and ‘to keep trying, even when it is difficult’.

Excellence - this value is about supporting students to strive to do their personal best. Excellence means we give our best to everything we do. When explaining this to children we talk about ‘when we practise excellence, we are not trying to be better than anyone else; we are striving to be the best we can be’.

All members of the school community have rights and responsibilities, and these are best ensured when agreed procedures are accepted and followed. Primary school students are developing appropriate ways to interact with others. The school and its community share the responsibility to assist students in learning appropriate behaviours.

Our PBL Matrix of expectations supports students to interact in positive and productive ways. The matrix outlines how we - students, staff and the community - are **safe, respectful, learners** at school.

You may have heard in the media that Australian Curriculum has been updated recently. Some of the changes include:

- a 21% reduction in content descriptors, encouraging school to go deeper into learning
- a stronger focus on phonics teaching in English
- a stronger focus on students mastering essential mathematical facts, skill, concepts and processes
- a revision of the sequencing of maths content.

These changes have an impact on our school-based documentation and teachers now have the job of updating our documents to reflect current Australian Curriculum. This is quite a task so we will be doing a staged process across the next six to twelve months.

A reminder that tomorrow is a school planning day and we ask that where possible, children stay home. If your child needs to attend school please call the office to book them in so we can plan supervision across the day.
