Hello Everyone

This is the last week the School Satisfaction Survey is open so please take a few minutes to complete the survey before the 30 August. When it comes to reading it can be tricky to help children choose books. Supporting your child to access books of interest is very important. Teachers scaffold children into more complex texts using a variety of strategies. This is vital because reading rich texts helps students extend vocabulary, learn about the lives of others, laugh, cry, feel, develop insight, think more deeply, question, interpret and evaluate. Sometimes your child may bring home a book from library borrowing that is too complex for them to read alone. Reading to children models fluent reading and a love of books. It helps them access texts beyond what they can read alone. Reading aloud to your child provides the opportunity to talk about the vocabulary and deepen their knowledge about difficult concepts within the text. This is just as important, if not more important, than your child reading alone.

Kindergarten BASE assessments will be coming home today so please check your child's bag for this information.

With spring fast approaching a reminder that all children need their hats at school every day. As it gets warmer children will also start taking off jumpers so be sure to label all clothing items so they can be returned to families if lost.

Our bubblers are still not in use so bringing a drink bottle each day is essential. Children can refill drink bottles at school and are encouraged to drink throughout the day.

## NEWS FROM THE P&C

*Did you know ...* that there are 11 languages taught in Australian schools? These are: Chinese, Italian, French, German, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Spanish, Arabic, Modern Greek and Vietnamese.



### ACT CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME

Did you know, that for every eligible container you recycle, the Macquarie Primary School can get 10 cents? This can really add up.

Eligible containers include most plastic, cardboard and metal containers between 150ml and 3L.

If you have eligible containers and can drop them off to a collection point, you can use the Macquarie Primary School P&C Code so the containers get credited to the P&C account.

Our code is:

The closest collection points are at the Hawker Shops, the ACT Basketball Courts in Belconnen and Anglicare Retail store at the Jamison Centre.
