# The Macquarie Memo

### Issue 17: 9 June 2022

### From our Principal

Last week we prepared a presentation for new families coming to Macquarie Primary School in 2023. I thought it would be worthwhile sharing some of the information from that session with our whole community because it consolidates how we do things and reasons behind why we do things in a particular way.

Parents often want to understand how we manage student behaviour. School is different to home and we need tighter boundaries in order to maintain a high level of safety due to the number of students and the range of experiences and knowledge they come with.

At home your children may climb trees, may wrestle with you or siblings, in some homes reacting physically to a situation is ok - at school we have different boundaries to ensure everyone feels safe and that being part of our community is a good place to be. This can be challenging for children to understand that in different places, there are different expectations around how they interact with others. Sometimes children struggle to meet the expectations around behaviour in the school environment. When a student struggles with reading we provide additional support and adjustments, we do the same with behaviour. We believe all behaviour is communication, all behaviour serves a function - to seek or avoid - and when we understand the function we can provide alternate, often more appropriate, ways for students to have their needs met in the school environment. Our Positive Behaviours for Learning approach guides this work.

Sometimes, students find meeting expectations particularly challenging due to a disability, trauma, behavioural diagnosis or a range of other reasons. When a student responds by hurting or attempting to hurt others, we have a number of steps to implement to reduce risk. We use our student support team, drawing on collective knowledge to address behavioural challenges and safety risk. We work with the Education Directorate to complete risk assessments, make use of Allied Health services within the Directorate, allocate additional resources to support individual students, work closely with families who know their child best...all in order to increase safety. We document all adjustments, update plans and meet regularly with school staff and professionals working with students. In these situations it is a bit of an iceberg, what you see on the surface may look like we are calmly implementing various strategies, looking for effectiveness and adjusting as needed but below the surface we are doing a plethora of actions to reduce risk and create a safe and engaging environment for all students to learn.

I'd also like to share with you some information about our learning approach. We choose to use inquiry pedagogy -Inquiry helps position 'how' we teach. The Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards guides 'what' we teach. We use the inquiry lenses - Social Responsibility, Environmental Sustainability, Identity, Creativity, Wellbeing and the Physical World - to connect learning in meaningful ways. The Learning Assets - we are thinkers, we are collaborators, we are researchers, we are communicators and we are self-managers - identify the 21st century skills and dispositions we want learners to have into their future. The school values - persistence, integrity and excellence are some of the basic beliefs that guide attitudes and actions. The school expectations are our ways of operating to support the development of an orderly learning environment. Teachers do an incredible job of designing learning and engaging students using each of these to drive decision making, maximise learning opportunities and provide a rigorous program.

A couple of reminders...Don't forget we have photos tomorrow so all students need to be in full school uniform. On Tuesday 14 June, teachers will be having their second planning day for the term. We ask that families keep children at home on this day. If you need to send children to school you must let the front office know prior so we can plan for supervision.

On Tuesday, Jazzy Jumpers came to school to do a skipping demonstration. It was very exciting and inspired so many of our students to get skipping during break one. I'd like to thank the Jazzy Jumpers team for coming and showing us their impressive skills.

# EXPRESSIONSOF INTEREST FOR APPOINTED MEMBER ON SCHOOL BOARD

Do you know someone that would be a suitable addition to our school board or another school board in the ACT?

The Education Directorate is seeking expressions of interest from people to fill the position of "Appointed Member" on ACT public school boards. Expressions of interest will be used to fill vacant positions in schools across the ACT.

All ACT public schools have a school board. The school board is responsible for the school's strategic direction, its budget, policy implementation and related issues. Generally, school boards consist of:

- the school's principal;
- three parents and citizens members;
- two staff members;
- two student members (at high schools and colleges);
- one Appointed Member; and
- up to two Board Appointed Members (if any).

The appointed member is usually someone from outside the immediate school community, who is interested in and committed to public education. They bring an independent voice to board decisions. Appointments extend for periods up to two years and an appointed member may also be reappointed after the conclusion of their term.
